Legislative – Mr. Kornreich presented the Legislative Committee Report highlighting the following:

- Town of Brookhaven passed an ordinance for property owners to keep sidewalks clean and to clear them of snow for pedestrian safety.
- Mr. Kornreich testified at the joint assembly for the education budget (New York State
 Ways and Means Committee; Senate Finance; Education Commission) presenting his
 remarks regarding Outliers for the School Aide Formula. The remarks were well received
 and the legislature is now well aware of the issue.
- Legislative Breakfast was held at the Longwood School District. Presenters included Congressman Tim Bishop, Gary Bixhorn of Eastern Suffolk BOCES and the Long Island Coalition. Topics included new ways to calculate State aide. It has been introduced in the State Assembly by Assemblyman Steven Engelbright and in the State Senate by Senator Brian Foley.

WHEREAS, the Three Village Central School District authorizes the Town of Brookhaven to submit an application for a General Efficiency Implementation Grant under the Local Government Efficiency Grant Program, 2009-2010, State of New York, Department of State.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Board of the Three Village Central School District supports the aforementioned grant submission and authorizes Erica Dewar, Grants Coordinator, Department of Finance, Town of Brookhaven (and/or her designee) to serve as *Lead Applicant Contact Person*, submit the application, and execute all financial and/or administrative processes relating to the grant filed on behalf of our municipality and the Town of Brookhaven to New York State Department of State, Local Government Efficiency Grant Program, 2009-2010, not to exceed \$400,000 (the Town's cash match is 10%), which will offset a portion of the costs related to a Town-wide athletic fields coordination program, thereby improving access to services and reducing costs to all Town residents.
